- Not eroding capacity to building capacity
- PRSP'S, CDPF'S, CDF's to PRS's, NDP's

The internal developing country development process

- Individual/ Household level
- Village / Community level
- Provincial level
- National level
- Linkages to the international level
- Systems linkages and adaptive capacity

Individual/Household Level

- Mental attitudes to their own livelihoods
- Interest in community welfare
- Interest in national development
- Attitude to common and state property
- Interest in migration. To where?
- Beneficiary of remittances?
- Asset base, vision of future etc.

Village/Community Level

- Politically organized? Aware? Voice?
- Collective social action common?
- Level of participation in informal networks?
- Membership in formal groups
- Community asset base, vision of future etc
- Levels of volunteering
- Attitude to self-empowerment, readiness to take power,

Provincial Level

- Level of decentralized govt authority, capacity, responsibility, etc.
- Capture by local elites
- Level of co-operation between local govt and communities, trust ,contracts, etc.
- Relationship between local and central govts, supportive, antagonistic, neutral

National Level

- Good enough governance, accountability, human rights, institutional arrangements, organizational capacity(civil service etc..)
- Macro-economic fundamentals
- Relative levels of aid, remittances, fdi to gdp
- Levels of leakage of local revenue
- Levels of Dead capital
- Are local investors investing locally?
- Readiness, capacity to exploit globalization

Systems Linkages and Adaptive Capacity

- The foregoing levels are both autonomous and interdependent and they operate as a nested hierarchy or holarchy
- Negative and positive feedback loops will be many.
- Systemic linkages will be central to local ownership which will take place at different levels.
- Self-organization should be nurtured
- Adaptive capacity to shocks and stresses vital to sustainability of local ownership patterns
